2. Sell or Convey Surplus Vehicles to Fire Districts Resolution

Presenter: County Manager Andy Lucas

Due to multiple fire districts inquiring about the purchase of surplus County vehicles, County Manager Lucas presented a resolution that would enable the County to negotiate then sell or convey these vehicles to a fire district and/or non-profit volunteer fire department directly per NCGS 160A-274 and NCGS 160A-279. It was requested the Board review and consider approval of the resolution.

County Manager Lucas responded to questions concerning the County's utilization of GovDeals including the profitability of using this service, the process for determining sales prices for vehicles, and factors that influence the timing of County vehicle sales (such as mileage, age, and maintenance).

By motion, Commissioner Lawhon moved to approve the resolution as presented, seconded by Commissioner Hatley and carried by a 7 - 0 vote.
